The meeting began with **Open Mike**. First the Club's **Jam Band** played several pieces followed by Robert Doerr playing 2 pieces and then Bob Smith who played *La Cumparsita* and *Song of the Vagabonds*. Caroline Grannan and Jean Moshofsky performed together: a German *Ländler* and a French tune (translated roughly *Waltz of the Old Bones*; Ilya Kreymer played a Balkan tune; and Don Savant played *Serenade In Blue* and *Laura*; Val Kieser played *Smoke Gets In Your Eyes* and *Wunderbar*; and Skyler Fell played and sang *House Of The Rising*

Sun, on her Dallapè "Black Pearl" accordion. Lynn Ewing and Don Nurisso played several pieces, with Don performing the embellishment while Lynn played the melodies. Joe Domitrowich, our main performer for the day played using a "Concerto" MIDI accordion made by Paul Pasquali of Accordions International in Salt Lake City.

His performance included: A Medley for Two Guitars, Stenka Razin; Kalinka and Dark Eyes; the Blue Danube Waltz à la André Previn: Moliendo Café (jazz/salsa); his signature piece entitled Train Ride, with special effects and snatches of tunes from Dueling Banjo & Fiddle, I'm a Yankee Doodle Dandy, Folsom Prison Blues, and Orange Blossom Special. Joe played a Swiss Schottische, Steiner Chilbi, played at Polka speed, incorporating other instrumentsal voices; and the famous Big Band piece In The Mood. The MIDI he plays is capable of producing vocal harmony, which we heard in a duet with Joe and the Beatles-Ob-La-Di. Ob-La-Da! Switching to his strolling accordion, we heard the theme from Godfather, Come Back to Sorrento, and La Vie En Rose. Joe's ambitious schedule may be found on his websites, listed on pg. 6 under Performing Around the Bay. He also plays monthly at Esther's Café in Los Altos and at Lugano's Swiss Bistro in Carmel.

Umbria Sunset: Just another accordion story by Algis Ratnikas

I am not a professional musician, but I do enjoy composing and have written a few simple tunes for our local San Francisco Café Babar Jug Band. Early this year I began composing a tune for my daughter's wedding. She had met her fiance two years ago in Italy at the wedding of a mutual friend. They were both living in Manhattan at the time, but had not yet met. Last fall he gallantly asked me for her hand.

Their wedding was scheduled for June 11, 2011, at Passignano sul Trasimeno, Umbria, Italy, the hometown of the groom's parents. This was clearly going to be a major adventure for all involved.

In 217BC Carthaginian forces led by Hannibal destroyed a Roman army under consul Gaius Flaminicy in a battle at Lake Trasimenus in central Italy.



For the music I ignored Hannibal and focused on the first name initials of the bride and groom. The tune thus centered on the keys of A and D: A for Aldo, the groom, and D for Dalia, our daughter. Over the next few months the tune developed into something presentable and I introduced it to a musical group with whom I regularly meet. As I presented early versions the piece came to meet with some approval and suggestions. As an aside I cannot overemphasize how important it is to play together with others to help focus and develop personal skills. As June approached the tune became pretty well integrated into my very soul. I needed this level

of attachment just to make sure I would not embarrass my daughter and her guests in the precious moments of her special afternoon.

Months before this I had begun searching for a "new" used accordion. My trusty red student squeeze, an old present from my wife who gave up on it 50 years ago, was loosing high notes and weakening at its very seams. I logged on to Craig's List every day in search of a new "ax" reasonably priced, and traveled up and down the Bay Area looking for an appropriate breastplate. In March I made contact with the owner of an accordion that seemed to match my needs. We made a deal and I thus became the owner of lovely white, Settimo Soprani, Contino accordion.


The deal was negotiated at the Java Hut on the San Francisco waterfront. I immediately liked the seller, a young man who came in from Novato to strike the deal. The accordion came in a new looking, soft green carrying case. As I tested all the notes we talked of how he came to have it. Turns out his father, an old friend of Jim Boggio, had acquired it as a present for his efforts in helping organize the early Cotati Accordion festivals. This really connected us. I told him of knowing Jim through the SF Accordion Club and playing at one of the early festivals. When I explained my need for the accordion, the deal was sealed.

A day or so later I checked my phone messages and saw one that I did not immediately recognize. Caller ID said it was from Monroe Grisman. The last name rang a bell, and only then did I realize that the accordion I had purchased was from the son of David Grisman, renowned Bluegrass mandolin player and compatriot of Jerry Garcia, founding member of the Grateful Dead. I then christened my new "box" with "Dawgs Waltz," a tune made popular by Garcia and Grisman.
