A recent visit to Vince Cirelli's shop gave me an opportunity to see how the restoration of Pietro Diero's accordion was progressing (see last month's newsletter for the history of this accordion). The accordion is now completely dissassembled and Vince is using all the skills in his bag of tricks to rebuild the accordion back to its former glory. Like all of us the accordion structure shows lots of wear and tear from its age. But Vince is probably the only person left in the United States with the skills to undertake such a major historic restoration and not turn a major museum piece into worthless trash.

The completion date is planned for sometime in April of 1999. Vince has permission from the Diero family to bring it to a BAAC club meeting and perform on it. That should be an event to remember! After that first performance it will be sent to New York for display and than on tour to the major accordion clubs in the US.

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
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
A tetrachord is a <u>unit</u> consisting of 4 notes which are separated by a whole tone, whole tone, half tone.




When two tetrachords are connected by a whole tone, a major scale is formed



A tetrachord belongs to two different scales. It can be the <u>lower</u> in one scale, or the <u>upper</u> in another. The first and last notes of a tetrachord indicate the two keys it belongs to. By using the <u>upper</u> tetrachord from one scale as the <u>lower</u> tetrachord in a new scale, all of the key signatures containing sharps can be formed.





Use the thumb to start scales beginning on a white key. Use finger 2 to start scales beginning on a black key.
